Summary Results of Questionnaire Survey for Foreign Residents by "Mitaka Internationalization Round-Table Discussion"

The "Mitaka internationalization round-table discussion" was founded in 1999 to directly incorporate the opinions of foreign residents into Mitaka's municipal administration. Participants—of a variety of nationalities—consist of foreigners who live, work, or do other activities within the city, and representatives from various groups in Mitaka. The discussions have been held on various issues of importance to foreign residents including "education," "medical service," "disaster prevention," and "information."

A questionnaire survey for foreign residents was conducted for the first time in 10 years in the 6th term of the round-table (fiscal year 2009 and 2010, 2 years/term) to verify the recognition of current city government measures and to discover new issues. Below is an abstract of the summary of the results.

(1) Overall, the main sources of information are family members and friends, or other personal connections. However, for those who have lived in Japan for a short time, the internet is the main source of information. (2) In terms of Japanese language comprehension, relatively many Mitaka residents are at or above the level of "understand hiragana" and "understand slow conversations." (3) Students demand more information on community activities, events, jobs, and medical services; and other residents demand more information on medical service, parental care, and disaster prevention. (4) The recognition rates of foreign language publications issued by the city, including CITY NEWS, the Guidance Card with Useful Tips, and the Guide to Living in Mitaka City in 4 languages, are generally high. (5) On the whole, the demands of public parks, leisure facilities, and schools/classes for Japanese culture are high.

The level of satisfaction with living in Mitaka city seems relatively high. However, there are some issues to be worked on in everyday life and education. We, "Mitaka internationalization round-table discussion," will continue working to improve the living environment for foreign residents based on the findings of the questionnaire survey in cooperation with the city government, citizens, and various organizations. ◆About Earthquake / Heavy rain

◆How to dispose of garbage

Please refer to the Recycle Calendar for the collection days in each area. Combustible garbage and Non-combustible garbage should be disposed of in an authorized garbage bag and other garbage should be in a plastic bag, a plastic shopping bag or a container. The Maximum amount that one household can dispose of is up to three 40 liter authorized garbage bags for combustible and non-combustible garbage and up to three 45 liter size bags for other garbage. How to dispose of garbage is in the "Garbage Guide Pamphlet" (English, Chinese, Korean, and Japanese with kana).

City Budget for Fiscal Year 2011

Promotes sustainable town development with high environmental- and welfare-consciousness; aiming at "Mitaka's bright future" toward urban renaissance and community construction

Mitaka city marked its 60th anniversary last year, and many of its public facilities have reached the time for renovation. A prompt and well-planned response is required. The attenuation and hollowing-out of human relations in the community is accelerating, with increasing elderly single-person households as the population ages, fewer babies being born, and high rates of life expectancy. We dedicate this year to aim at "Mitaka's bright future" toward urban renaissance and community construction, together with further development of last year's measures in order to facilitate rapid response to these urban issues. We will realize "the city with affluence and grace" while continuously promoting "sustainable town development with high environmental- and welfare-consciousness," in order to fulfill our responsibilities for the future and for the people of Mitaka.

The budget scale, high-priority issues, and other priority issues are as follows:

<Budget scale>

General account budget: 64,987,117,000 yen (0.8 % increase over the previous year)

<High-priority issues>

"Urban renaissance" and "Community construction"

<Priority issues>

"Establishment of safety-net for living," "Enrichment of the environment for raising children and education," and "Institution of the 4th Mitaka City Master Plan and development and revision of individual plans with coproduction"

<Main projects>

Approach the implementation of the development of a disaster-prevention park in the area around Mitaka Civic Center (55.423 million); renovation of the City Public Hall and rebuilding of the hall annex (652.151 million); extension of childcare time of after-school day-care centers (505.389 million); invitation of registered private day-care facilities to public land (579.946 million); installation of air-conditioning in municipal elementary and junior-high schools (25 million); expansion of the community care promotion project (13.79 million); shopping support model project including home-delivery service (8 million)

Yuzo Yamamoto Memorial Museum Special Exhibition, "A Cultural Figure: Yuzo Yamamoto – the Postwar Era Reflected in 'Take'"

Yuzo Yamamoto (1887 ~ 1974), a novelist and playwright, worked to establish the list of kanji characters for general use and modern kana usage. He launched the magazine "Ginga (galaxy)" and edited Japanese textbooks, and he also served in the National Diet as a member of the House of Councilors.

This exhibition introduces his passion for the postwar reconstruction of Japan and his work as a member of the House of Councilors through his collection of essays "Take" (Bamboo), published in 1948.

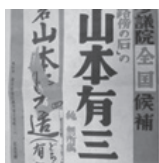
