Autumn Fire Prevention Campaign will Begin

This year's Autumn Fire Prevention Campaign will be held from November 9 (Wed.) to November 15 (Tue.).

This campaign is held to increase citizens' awareness toward fire prevention to prevent fire from starting and protect the lives and important properties from fire.

Mitaka City Fire Volunteers will tour and patrol the city during night (7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.) during the campaign. There will be a fire prevention parade with 14 fire engines and other vehicles of Mitaka City Fire Volunteers at the east and west of the city from 9:00 a.m. on November 9 (Wed.).

Heating appliances begin to be used and fires start more easily in the coming dry season. Please implement prevention measures such as avoiding to place things that catch fire easily.

The Tokyo Metropolitan Fire Prevention Ordinance was revised in April 2011 and installing fire alarms in every household became mandatory. Death from fire is thought to be caused mostly by late detection of fire. Fire alarms for households are effective for detecting fire at the early stages, those who don't have them are strongly advised to install them.

Changes in Child Allowance

The amount of the allowance (13,000 yen per month) was changed according to the following eligibility for October to March 2012 allowance.

New registration is required to continue receiving the allowance from October. A notice on registration method is sent to households with eligible child. It's also published on "Koho Mitaka" and City's homepage.

- ◇ **Allowance after Change (Monthly amount per child)**
- 0 year to less than three years old fixed 15,000 yen
- 3 years to elementary school age first and second child 10,000 yen
- 3 years to elementary school age third and subsequent child 15,000 yen
- Junior high school age fixed 10,000 yen
- * Child must reside inside Japan (excluding children studying abroad).
- * There is no income limit during fiscal year 2011.

Guide for Children with Foreign Citizenship Who Will Enroll in Elementary School in 2012

Guardians who have children born between April 2, 2005 and April 1, 2006 who do not have Japanese citizenship but wishing to enroll in a municipal elementary school from April 1, 2012 need to submit a completed Student Admission Application Form for Foreign Nationals available at the School Affairs Section.

Health checkup is held at each elementary school when entering school. If you wish to receive the checkup, please apply as soon as possible.

- ◆ **Required Documents**
- Student Admission Application Form for Foreign Nationals
- Copy of the child's foreign resident registration card, passport, or copy of a document that shows child's name, date of birth, gender, and address

Conserving Electricity Close to You

Here are some easy ways to conserve electricity in our daily life.

- ◇ **Conserving electricity of lights**
 - **Turn off the lights regularly**
Turn off the lights in unused rooms regularly and do not leave it on.
 - **Use energy-saving light bulbs**
Change the light bulbs from incandescent light bulbs to fluorescent light bulbs or LED light bulbs which use less electricity.
- ◇ **Conserving electricity of refrigerators**
 - **Is the temperature of refrigerators set correctly?**
Do you adjust temperature of refrigerators? As this season is cooler than the summer, set the temperature higher.
 - **Don't keep the door open**
Decide what you need before opening the door.
 - **Do something to keep the temperature low**
Installing refrigerator door curtains will prevent temperature from rising.
- ◇ **Conserving electricity of TVs**
 - **Don't make the screen brighter than necessary**
Adjust the brightness of the screen according to the brightness of the room.
 - **Don't leave it on**
If you don't have a program you want to watch, don't just leave it on and turn the TV off.
- ◇ **Conserving electricity of other electric appliances**
 - **Use energy-saving models**
If you are using old electric appliances, it may be a good time to think about replacing them with an energy-saving model.
 - **Cut down standby electricity**
Unplug electric appliances that will not be used for an extended time.
